As I walked down the hallway to the class room where we have our worship services, I wondered if any of the women made the trek from their tiers to the chapel area. When I opened the door, there were 11 women singing Christmas hymns. They greeted me with applause.

During the reading of the First Lesson in walks Viola Noffsinger trudging her keyboard. Her drive was further than mine. Once again, she was greeted by the ladies with applause. Worship was spirited, rich and heart felt that evening. As I often do, I felt a sense of deep gratitude for making the trip to be involved with The Community of St. Dysmas.

I share this experience for a several reasons. First note the commitment of the ladies of The Community of St. Dysmas. They gathered for worship whether the worship leaders could make it or not. They were singing Christmas Hymns when I arrived. Secondly the faithfulness of our volunteers. Viola made the trip (over a hour one way) that Saturday evening despite the weather. Finally, the deep appreciation of the ladies for our

volunteers. The "outside guest" who give of their time and talents for the sake of this ministry are welcomed by the men and women who make up CSD in all four of our Institutions. You are prayed for and anticipated. (Pastors and musicians imagine being greeted by applause in your congregations some Sunday)!

CSD ANNUAL MEETING

On Sunday the 3rd of December eleven of us met for the Annual Meeting of The Community of St. Dysmas.

We began by hearing a "Keynote" from Linda Fleischer who is a Professor of Criminal Justice at the Dundalk Campus of Baltimore County Community College. Her presentation was both personal and professional. She shared eye opening statistics about the causes of incarceration and the obstacles folks faced upon their release leading to recidivism in our society.

Bob Harvey reported our positive finances and a Budget of \$107,363 was approved for

2018.

A needed discussion followed concerning the lack of new volunteers and the impact that could mean for the future of CSD. Amongst the concerns is the aging of our current volunteers and obstacles with which we deal by the Institutions.
